Important COVID-19 Testing update

Dear Parent/Carers

We are very pleased to share the news that our school is taking part in an exciting new Hampshire and Isle of Wight COVID-19 Testing Programme this term.

This new test is very simple and involves collecting a sample of saliva in a plastic pot. The test used is the one featured in a [BBC News piece in July](#). Free weekly tests will be offered to **all students** and **all staff** at the school.

You will receive a testing pack which contains pots and a leaflet that shows your child how to collect a sample at home, to be dropped off in school.

Why is this important?

Knowing who has COVID-19 is vital to stopping its spread.

We hope that you are as excited as we are about the potential for this test to help us manage the risk of COVID-19. Alongside all the other measures we are taking to control the virus, it could help us to keep our communities safe and well and keep our school open. We will also be paving the way for this test to be used to help in the recovery from COVID-19 across the country.

Testing is not compulsory, but I strongly encourage every student to take part. Included in this letter is a link to register your child so that they can take part in this exciting programme.

How will the testing work?

We will inform you when testing is due to start, but it is likely to be in the next few weeks. The saliva test will replace the Lateral Flow Device tests that we have been using in school. The saliva test is more sensitive, accurate and much more accessible, and I know that you will want as much as we do, to try and keep school as safe as possible for everyone.

For those students who have been identified as extremely vulnerable or from families of key workers and who are currently attending school, where appropriate, we will be giving them a series of virtual engagement lessons so they can learn about how the test works and how regular testing can help keep them and their community safer.

Students will then bring their test kit and labels home from school the day before their first test as well as a leaflet giving step by step instructions. They will be given enough sample pots and labels for eight weeks of testing. **It is important that your child takes the test when they wake up - before they have anything to eat or drink and before they brush their teeth.**

Once the sample has been labelled and bagged, your child will need to bring it to school with them and put it into the collection box at the entrance they use each day. The tests will be collected and taken to the test centre on the same day. Test results will be returned in the

next 24-48 hours and you will receive a text message telling you the result of your child's test.

If your child tests positive, everyone in the household must start isolating immediately. The programme team will contact you and ensure you get the help and advice you need. Please note that this test is for testing children who do not have symptoms of COVID-19. If your child does have COVID-19 symptoms they should not attend school and you should order a test through 111.nhs.uk or by calling 119.

If your child is absent from school or forgets to bring in their test, they can bring it in on the next collection day – their tutor will tell them where to take their sample pot. The school will have some spare packs to hand out to anyone who loses their sample pots but we would encourage you to keep them somewhere safe as spares are limited.

Important information about your data

To enable the partnership running the COVID-19 Testing Programme between University Hospital Southampton, local government, and the University of Southampton to deploy the test kits to the school and to manage the collection of samples from schools, our school will be sharing contact details of students and their parents or guardians, as well as staff, with University Hospital Southampton NHS Foundation Trust.

As you know from our school's GDPR and Privacy Notice:

we are very serious about protecting the personal data of all members of our school community, and we will maintain this approach in relation to this data sharing. We will only be sharing limited contact details. The NHS will share confidentially with nominated senior leadership within the School positive test results to enable immediate initiation of contact tracing to minimise the risk of the virus spreading.

In line with our dynamic Whole School Covid-19 Risk Assessment, we are at the limit of students that we can currently safely accommodate in school. We are hoping that when we can have more students in school the saliva test will enable us all to feel safer. It will be really important at this stage to know the COVID-19 status of as many of us as possible, so I would urge you all to agree to participate, even if at the moment your child is learning from home. When your child is able to return to school, they will be included in the weekly saliva testing programme and will also be given education in school about the testing process. However, you must register to take part now, and not wait until you know they are returning as the programme cannot add anyone once we have registered and so we need to receive your registrations by 5pm on Tuesday 26th January.

If you agree to participate in the new saliva test programme, please cut and paste this link into your browser to register your child.

This will take you to the schools SurveyMonkey form which will ask you the name of your child (please type in both forename and surname) and the name of the parent/carer who will be receiving their results by text and the mobile phone number that you wish the programme to use.
