- Compare the impact to modern examples and impact upon England


AUT 2: "The Norman conquest"

SPR 2: Early civilisation study—Mayan

- What is the Mayan Civilisation?
- What was life like?
- How do we know about the Mayan civilisation? (Sources/archeology work.)
- Comparison study—Mayan Civilisation to another civilisation.
- Research study—achievements and success—what do we still use today?

SUM 1: WW1

- How did WW1 begin? Focus on cause and effect and how they link.
- The Western Front—what was life like here? Compare sources
- The Home Front— How did the people at home support their soldiers?
- Censorship and propaganda—what was it? Impact and source evaluation.
- War is over—how did it end? Treaty of Versailles
- Remembrance— Importance and meaning

SUM 2 : Significant turning point in British History

- In-depth study /research project on a significant event in British History, examples:
 - First Railways
 - Industrial revolution
 - Battle of Britain
 - British Empire falls
 - Magna Carta

SPR 1: Vikings

- Viking raids and invasion.
- Resistance by Alfred the Great and Athelstan, first king of England.
- Further Viking invasions and Danegeld
- Anglo-Saxon laws and justice.
- Battle of Hastings
- Edward the Confessor and his death in 1066

AUT 2 “Where have the Romans gone?”

- Roman withdrawal AD 410
- The fall of the Roman Empire (western)

SPR 2: Egyptians

- In-depth study of King Tut—who was he? Why is he famous?
- Archeology link with the discovery of King Tut’s tomb.
- Sources and evidence to justify and how this helps us know what has happened.
- Impact an ancient civilisation has on modern day—what benefits did we get from it?
- How is Ancient Egypt relevant today?

SUM 1: Local Study—Aviation in Farnborough

- Study of local history beyond 1066 that is significant in local area.
- Significant turning point in Britain—why?
- Exploration of aviation—how did aviation occur?
- Study of significant individuals e.g. Samuel Cody, The Wright Brothers, Amelia Earhart.
- Impact of aviation in local area across history.
- Impact it has today.

SUM 2: “British Monarchs”

- Explore the life and times of key British Monarchs (John, Anne and Victoria)
- Explore Art and culture during these different times
- Impact on England
- What power did they have and how has that changed?

SPR 1: Egyptians

- Develop understanding of ancient civilisations and how long ago they were.
- - In depth study into the lives of Egyptians—how did they live?
- Study of significant individual (Pharaoh) and their impact.—why were they significant?
- Begin to explore use of sources to help support historical knowledge—different versions of the same event.
- Use sources to analyse and answer questions about an ancient civilisation.

AUT 2: Greeks

- How the Greeks benefitted us today.
- Explore Greek lifestyle and compare to Britain today.
- Study of Greek life—what was it like?
- Explore achievements during the Greek era.
- Identify and explore a significant individual or civilisation impacted us today.
- Olympics—significant event.
